Dear Ms. Melt:

We have reviewed and considered your grievance against the agency to which you applied for a position, the Office of Culinary Arts, dated July 25, 2020. In your grievance, you allege a violation of the selection and hiring process for the Baking Manager position. In an effort to resolve this matter, we have attempted to contact you on several occasions, without success. Consequently, your grievance is **dismissed**.

In accordance with 6-B DCMR § 1637, the failure to furnish required information or duly proceed with the advancement of a grievance shall result in dismissal. We have made multiple unsuccessful attempts over several weeks to contact you by phone and email in order to obtain additional information needed to conduct an investigation on your allegation. We have received no response. Therefore, your grievance is dismissed.
